

I am now requesting, in relation to Schedule 2, s 4 (a) to (e) of the Food and Environment Protection Act 1985, Chapter 48, the following documents:

- Site specific Environmental Risk Assessment for the use of rodenticides on this estate.
- Training certificates of and and and relation to the use of rodenticides, fumigants and herbicides.
- Stock control book or similar document for the supply of pesticides by the estate to its game keeping staff.
- Map of the game keeper beats on the same and information as to which game keeper is responsible for each beat since 1st January 2009.

Further to this request, I understand from my colleague that on the 13th October 2009 a quantity of the fumigant Phostoxin was found in a storage building used by game keeper the lam therefore writing

Natural England Head Office 1 East Parade Sheffield S1 2ET to you to request that you ensure that this pesticide is stored in compliance with the HSE instructions, these being that vertebrate fumigant products should be:

- Stored within a separate storage cabinet in your pesticide store which should be made of metal or fire-resistant materials.
- This cabinet should be located above the level of the store bunding and away from direct sunlight and sources of heat.
- This cabinet should be provided with adequate stability, eg bolted to the wall.
- The external wall / door of the storage area should carry the warning sign: "Gassing Compound – Do Not Use Water"
